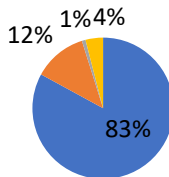

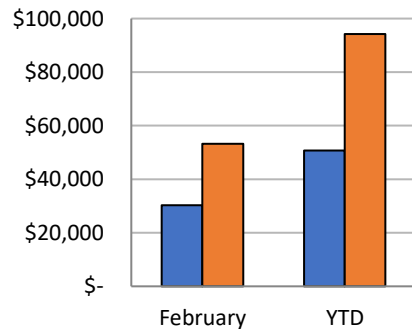

Approved Council Meeting Minutes, March 8, 2026:

Members present: Cher, Jimmy, Marti, Connie, Betsy, Brent, Ricky, Pastor Keith, Patricia, Taylor, and Eric.

- I. Cher called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.
- II. Patricia Tiffner offered a devotion on Patience and read from Ephesians 2. This reminds us we are all works in progress and we need to have more patience with ourselves.
- III. Prayer Concerns – Susie Hendrix, Freida Banks, family of Charlie Long (Todd), Steven Humphries, Toshia Banks Training and SP Teams at Michelin and Ervin (surgery 3/12).
- IV. Pastor Keith reported his report was emailed 3/5.
 - Attendance is consistent from last year.
 - They have met with Mutual Ministry and have goals set.
 - Hazel Short and Elizabeth Short have been attending worship and plan to join our church sometime during Lent.
 - Taylor motioned to accept Pastor's report and Marti seconded.
- V. Connie stated the Financial Secretary's Report was emailed earlier in the week.
 - We are slowly getting Lily money in.
 - We had some Thrivent Choice money come through this month designated for the Endowment Fund.
 - Ricky motioned to accept Connie's Financial Secretary's report and Patricia seconded.
- VI. Brent gave a Treasurer's Report.
 - We reviewed the February financial statements.
 - We paid \$22,000 in early February for the paint job. The Preschool will reimburse 30% of the bill plus \$1200 to pay for overtime they authorized to paint afterhours. We paid \$650 to Matrix Energy services for changing all of the lights.
 - YTD offerings are down slightly but understandable with the 2 Sundays that we were out of church with the snow and ice.
 - We reviewed the Endowment financials.
 - Taylor motioned to accept Brent's Treasurer's Report and Jimmy seconded.
- VII. Cher gave a President's Report.
 - Jessica Nead has completed her Background check. Jessica and Amanda Antonovich have agreed to help lead the KICS. Amanda has not completed her background check as of yet. The SLED report will go in the file in the office with Becky.
 - First Sunday Lunch April will be hosted by the Lectionary Sunday School Class. It is moved to April 12th due to Easter being on the 1st Sunday.
 - We discussed who will be Wittenberg Representatives at the Synod Assembly. Cher made a motion to accept Patricia Tiffner and Jerry Price to represent our church at Synod Assembly. Taylor seconded. All agreed.
 - We had discussion on what organization we wanted to support with our Lenten Service Offerings. Cher made a motion to donate Lenten offerings to Camp Kinard toward the new chapel project. Ricky seconded. All agreed.
 - 2026 Council Goals – We are in motion to complete the 1st goal and are still working on the remaining goals.
 - Patricia motioned to accept Cher's Presidential Report and Marti seconded.
- VIII. Committee Reports
 - AV&T:** Taylor Davis – Pastor said the wi-fi connection was not showing up. Brian was able to unplug everything and got it back going.
 - Cemetery:** Michael Guerette – Cher read Michael's report in his absence. There was a headstone on the verge on falling down. He had a headstone reset from Snelgrove for \$150 to repair.
 - Christian Education:** Betsy Dority – We met 2/22. We planned the Easter Egg Hunt for Palm Sunday, 3/29 following the 11:00 Worship Service. We will provide lunch, a craft or activity provided by KICS, Debbie Sawyer will lead the Stations of the Cross through the cemetery and of course hunt for eggs. We set VBS for June 7 – 10, Sunday through Wednesday. We set dates for the Children's Choir to sing during the 11:00 worship service on Palm Sunday, Easter Sunday and on Youth Sunday. We are working on updating the Sunday School class offerings sign with class locations. And are also working on signs to label the classrooms. We have developed a Nursery schedule to have someone assigned to the Nursery every Sunday during the 11:00 worship service.
 - Endowment:** Eric Dickey reported they are accepting applications through the end of the month. We can award up to \$8000 in grants. The application is online. They will meet again early April to review applications and make recommendations to Council. Winners will be announced in May with 1st Sunday lunch.
 - Evangelism & Christian Care:** Marti Burns reported they took Banana Pudding to Jeffrey Shealy on his birthday and a basket of goodies for Holly Fulmer who broke her leg. They are working on organizing the diaper changing tent for the Poultry Festival.
 - Mutual Ministry:** Cher Davis reported they met this week. They are focused on congregation concerns. They made another list of goals. Please pass along any concerns or praises that you may know of.
 - Parish Life:** Toshia Banks – Cher reported in Toshia's absence. They asked S&F to help them with 1st Sunday Lunch in August. Okayed by Jimmy and Brent.
 - Pre-School:** Debbie Black - no report
 - Property:** Cher Davis (Council Liaison) reported 8" gutter guards were installed and a small section of 6" gutter guards. They are hopeful to have the rest of the guards installed soon. Carpet cleaning is scheduled for Thursday, March 26. They will meet tomorrow night to change a light bulb in the sanctuary.
 - Social Ministry:** Ricky Frick reported the Soup Kitchen served 125 meals in February. The committee is requesting to purchase of a new commercial can opener for the church kitchen. The requested model costs

between \$130 and \$145, and Social Ministries would like to fund this purchase. This would come out of Soup Kitchen Funds. Taylor motioned, Jimmy seconded. All agreed. Approximately 150 bag lunches were prepared in February by Betsy Dority, Ruth Brigham, and Wendy Epting. The Food Pantry served 200 families in February. Stewardship & Finance: Jimmy St. Jean reported they met earlier tonight. Nothing to report further from the Treasurer's Report.

Strategic Planning: Cher Davis reported they met and reviewed the Vision 20+20 report from 2022. They plan to meet again to update the report and list current goals. They would like approval from Council to look into room for Preschool expansion. Eric made a motion to allow the Strategic Planning Committee and along with the Preschool Committee to begin to look at expansion plans. Taylor seconded. All agreed.

Worship & Music: Patricia Tiffner reported Davis Taylor donated the purple and white cloth for the cross. We are sending him a Thank you card tonight.

Youth: Taylor Davis – B-L Spring Clean 3/21 9-12. Everyone is welcome!

Ricky motioned to accept the Committee Reports and Taylor seconded.

-There was no old business or new business to discuss.

-The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 7:59pm.
