Greetings, Wittenberg family,

Lent begins this month, starting with Ash Wednesday on the 18th. During our Wednesdays in Lent, our services will be Holden Prayer. We will also have a short homily on various Old Testament events and how they point to Jesus Christ's death and resurrection and to the Christian life. The themes are as follows:

- 2/25 The Passover
- 3/4 Jonah and the Whale
- 3/11 The Parting of the Red Sea
- 3/18 Wandering in the Wilderness
- 3/25 Three Youths in the Fiery Furnace from the Book of Daniel

These services will be an opportunity for us to center ourselves in Christ through prayer and better be prepared for Holy Week and the celebration of the Easter season.

Many of us will be celebrating Valentine's Day on February 14th. However, as we begin Lent this month, I am reminded of the love that knows no limits, no end, the love of God in Christ Jesus. It is this sacrificial and self-giving love that is revealed to us in the life-giving cross, on which Jesus pours out his life to the point of death, so that love and life would have the final word and not sin and death. Holy Scriptures are clear that God's people are called to love God with all their heart, soul, and might and their neighbor as themselves. And, this love is not just emotional love but love in concrete action. May we daily show the love of Christ, self-giving love, to those we have a relationship with, and to those in our community, and the world who are in need of help and love. The love we show on Valentine's Day should be a small token of the love we show others each and every day, each and every moment of our lives, in the big and, especially, in the daily little mundane things we do to help ease someone's burden and enhance their joy of life.


WINTER



Approved Council Meeting Minutes, January 11, 2026:

Members present: Cher Davis, Toshia Banks, Marti Burns, Connie Kramer, Betsy Dority, Brent Shealy, Jimmy St. Jean, Ricky Frick, Kim Hendrix, Michael Guerette, Pastor Keith, Patricia Tiffner, Debbie Black and Eric Dickey.

- I. Cher called the meeting to order 7:00pm.
- II. Cher offered a devotion focusing on James 1:5 encouraging our Council to be good leaders.
- III. Prayer Concerns - Jeffery Shealy, Linda Price, Mary Cook, Helen Dasher, and Ross Cary. Good News at Wittenberg - Happy Birthday Kim and Pastor Keith! EKG went well for Pastor Keith.
- IV. Pastor's Report – Pastor Keith emailed his report earlier in the week but highlighted we had good Christmas Eve attendance. Combined in both services we had 242 which is up 20 from 2024. Next, he will start to work on Lenten Services. Michael motioned to accept Pastor's Report and Ricky seconded.
- V. Financial Secretary's Report- Connie emailed report earlier in the week. We had very generous donations in December. Ricky motioned to accept Connie's report and Patricia seconded.
- VI. Treasurer's Report – Brent reviewed the Balance Sheet. We ended the month outside of Hare Reserve at \$83,355.96. \$44,000 is unrestricted. With the Hare Reserve, our balance is \$111,830.96. We had a very strong year of regular offerings, up 3.6%. Endowment Fund also increased \$22,000 compared to 2024. Brent explained "Other Designated Offering Payees" is where the ELCA Good Gifts (collected over \$2000) or other similar offerings go in then come back out. Patricia motioned to accept Brent's report and Debbie seconded.
- VII. President's Report – Cher reported we have 3 Workplace Anniversaries - Randy Fellers, Rachel Young, Mary Ann Shealy. We will recognize them Sunday, 1/18. Cher went over Committee assignments and the Devotion schedule for each Council meeting.
- VIII. Committee Reports
 - AV&T: Taylor Davis- No report
 - Cemetery: Michael Guerette- No Report
 - Christian Education: Betsy Dority. We will start planning the Easter Egg Hunt.
 - Endowment: Eric Dickey- Endowment Committee will meet monthly until Grants are awarded and also will meet with Edward Jones. Eric plans to come in on last of S&F meeting to talk about Endowment each month.
 - Evangelism & Christian Care: Marti Burns- No report.
 - Mutual Ministry: Cher Davis- No report.
 - Parish Life: Toshia Banks- She is working on BBW and 1st Sunday Lunch schedules.
 - Pre-School: Debbie Black- The Preschool Committee is looking for a new member.
 - Property: Cher Davis (Council Liaison) - Dominion will convert fluorescent lights in new building (Fellowship Hall, Preschool area, Bathrooms) to LED lights. All tables and chairs will need to be moved for this work to be done. WLC is responsible for \$672 for this work. 1/19-1/21 Jay Shumpert will start painting all areas in the new building (Fellowship Hall, Preschool area, bathrooms, Commons Area, Kitchen). He will possibly work during evenings around the Preschool. This project will cost \$20,815.20. The Preschool will help cover some of this cost.
 - Social Ministry: Ricky Frick, Kim Hendrix- Kim reported the Soup Kitchen served 127 families and the Food Pantry served 318 families.
 - Stewardship & Finance: Jimmy St. Jean- S&F met tonight and will continue to meet monthly before Council meetings.
 - Strategic Planning: Cher Davis- No report
 - Worship & Music: Patricia Tiffner- Rebecca Reed and Jarrod Frick will hold OSJ training at end of February. Torrey Dickey is joining the Altar Guild Committee. Shrove Tuesday is 2/17. The Youth will host the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. We had discussion on not offering BBW on the same Sundays as 1st Sunday Lunches. Eric motioned to not have BBW during 1st Sunday Lunch Sundays. Marti seconded. All approved.
 - Youth: Taylor Davis- No report.
- IX. New Business
 - Our February Council meeting and all-committee night will be moved to 2/15 due to the Super Bowl. Council will meet at 6:00 followed by All-Committee night at 7:00.
- X. Old Business
 - Council committee reports for Yearbook were due by Dec 31.
 - From discussions in S&F Committee meeting earlier, Brent mentioned contributing an extra 10% from our year-end balance to the Synod. \$5,000 to Synod, \$2,000 to Lutheran Retreat Centers, \$2,000 to Social Services of Carolinas and \$2,000 to Lutheran Homes. Jimmy motioned to contribute \$11,000 from WLC to various Lutheran organizations and services as they feel needed. Pastor will help to give recommendations for Lutheran organizations to contribute to. Ricky seconded. All approved.

Our meeting was adjourned at 7:52pm. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.


