Greetings, Wittenberg family,

This Easter, we heard the holy Gospel according to St. John, which is an alternative reading for Easter. The other Gospel reading for this year would have been from Mark. In Mark 16:1-8, the resurrection of Jesus is very stark. The angel tells them to proclaim the resurrection, to tell others that "Christ was dead, Christ is risen." Jesus will meet them in Galilee where he first called his disciples. Jesus invites them to be with him and to reach out into the darkness of the world, shining the light of the resurrection. And we, too, are to follow Jesus and do mission in the world, knowing that he always goes ahead of us and meets us there. "So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid." Not exactly the triumphant shout of Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Fear is a powerful thing. It can isolate us from Jesus. It can keep us from following him. That is why it is so important that we take time out each and every day to be with Jesus. The more we are with him, the less our fear will paralyze us from doing his work and being with him. Even if the women failed Jesus, Jesus will not fail them.

So, take comfort in knowing that no matter how imperfect our faith may be, and no matter how many times we remain silent when we should testify to the gospel, we can always return to the Lord. None of us can get so far away from Jesus that we cannot be touched by God's healing presence.

Mark ends without a resurrection appearance from Jesus. Ironically, it ends with the women leaving in silent fear; although, we know that the story of Jesus' resurrection did not end with them. St. Mark brings us along the narrative journey only to leave us hanging in the middle of the story.

Why is this?

Because St. Mark wants to invite us to allow our own lives to be written into the ongoing story of the resurrection. He offers us an invitation to be more than beneficiaries and custodians of the story but also servants of Christ and God's costly outreach to the world. In truth, the gospel story really doesn't have an ending. It is still unfolding through the lives of Christ's followers, you and me. And it will continue to unfold until our Lord returns and we fully experience the power of Jesus Christ and the resurrection. Truly "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again."








Approved Council Meeting Minutes, March 10, 2023:

Members Present: Robin Taylor, Wendy Epting, Mike Nichols, Brent Shealy, Pastor Keith Getz, Ross Cary, Connie Kramer, Betsy Dority, Michael Guerette, Debbie Black, Betsy McEwen, Justin Trotter and Andrew Hendrix.

Andrew called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm.

Special Presentation: Kara Jefferson with Sole Stepping

Kara is asking to put a donation bin (25"W x 17"D x 15"H) in our church. It will be a wooden box with the Sole Stepping logo and painted to match the décor of the area that it is placed. This bin will be used to collect new shoes, socks and used shoes. They collect toddler to adult sized athletic shoes. Sole Stepping currently has over 60 schools waiting to be served by this ministry.

Betsy McEwen offered a memory of moving to B-L and joining Wittenberg. She shared a devotion on knowing joy.

Jerry Price and family of Tissy Price. Charles Nichols- he is at home but eating and drinking very little. Please keep Ann in your prayers. Chris Smith is doing better- he has been moved to a rehab facility (Encompass Health) and is progressing well. Brent suggested to send a welcoming card to the new members who joined today. Andrew will send these to the new members on behalf of council.

Pastor's Report for March

Our average attendance is up to 100 compared to 91 last year. We have had good attendance at our Wednesday night Lent Services with 40 to 45 in attendance.

Synod Assembly is 6/8/24. It is a one-day meeting all done online. Andrew and Mike volunteered to be representatives. Ross motioned to accept Andrew and Mike as representatives to attend. Debbie seconded. All in favor.

Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary is moving to Lenoir-Rhyne in Hickory, NC.

The AA group that meets in town is asking if they can meet at Wittenberg once a week. Their current location is not in good shape. Pastor is suggesting offering Wittenberg on Saturday mornings so the Food Pantry will be able to open the church and lock the church back.

However, the AA group would like to stick to Friday verings. We have a church member that has stepped forward and is willing to open and lock up the church on Friday evenings for them. This has been tabled for more discussion in April's meeting.

Ross motioned to accept the President's report. Mike seconded. All in favor.

Treasurer's Report

Our deficit for operations is smaller this month at \$5,429. Our regular offerings are up 24.1% over last year.

Designated offerings are down a little bit from last year. However, we remain at good surpluses for the Food Pantry and Soup Kitchen.

Endowment Fund February was a good month in the markets. We will have Endowment grants coming up to distribute in May.

Brent misclassed \$1200 in Evangelism in February and this was reclassed to Food Pantry.

Ross motioned to accept the Treasurer's report, Debbie seconded.

Financial Secretary's Report

Connie reported the Food Pantry had a good month in February and we also had the largest amount collected in Noisy Offering. 42 lilies have been ordered. Next Sunday is the last day to order lilies. Thrivent Choice money has come in and will have more coming in in May. Ross motioned to accept the Financial Secretary's Report. Debbie seconded. All in favor.

Facility Use Request - Pastor Getz is requesting use of the Fellowship Hall on Saturday, May 18, 2024 from 2-4 pm for Caroline's graduation party. Andrew proposed to accept the request for the use of the Fellowship Hall for the Getz Family on 5/18/24 from 2-4. Ross motioned to accept the proposal. Debbie seconded. All in favor.

Sole Stepping – We had discussion where we could put the donation box. Ross made a motion that we will participate as a receiving location and we will put the box outside the covered entrance on the cemetery side. Wendy seconded. All in favor.

Ross motioned to accept the President's Report. Wendy seconded. All in favor.

AV&T: Betsy Dority – no report. Wendy reported problems hearing the choir online. The Pastor's volume is fine. The mic near the piano and organ are loud but you cannot hear the choir singing. Possibly adjust the mics down on the organ and piano. Betsy will look into this.

Cemetery: Michael Guerette reported he took a walk through the cemetery. The grass starting to overgrow on flat markers. There is also a lot of

green moss and growth growing on markers. Mike said he has a chemical to apply on the marker and then you can scrape it off. Are there ways to encourage families to clean the markers? It is not the church's responsibility to keep these clean. Andrew suggested talking to Landis for his advice as to how to handle this.

Christian Education: Betsy McEwen announced "Camp Callout" VBS will be June 2, 3, 4th from 5:30-7:30. Kayce has ordered material and is working on volunteers.

Endowment: Andrew Hendrix reported they met on all committee night. They voted to offer the 4% of the fund for disbursement which totals \$6400. They changed the application that recipients must be present on Endowment Sunday to accept the check and speak a few words about their

Evangelism & Christian Care: Wendy Epting reported they met on all committee night. They decided to continue with newborn basket program, laundry mat bags and visitor bags. They will also continue to take meals to members with health concerns. They delivered 7 meals to members/families in February. They will also continue with diaper changing station at The SC Poultry Festival.

Mutual Ministry: Andrew Hendrix - no report

Parish Life: Robin Taylor reported April lunch is Lectionary Sunday School class. They have a trip planned to the Farmers Market 4/11 for the spring flower market.

Pre-School: Debbie Black reported they met 2/11. Debbie and Betsy are planning to meet with Layce on 3/18 and then with Vicky. Ross and Steve got some information on the storage building. Steve is meeting with Layce tomorrow morning at 10:00 with that information.

Property: Mike Nichols reported Jason Feaster is working to put in an exhaust system in the Parsonage's bathrooms where there is currently no exhaust. Steam is causing problems with paint. We are looking for someone who is able to change the light bulbs in the ceiling of the sanctuary. Please let Mike or Ross know of any volunteers. Ross Cary reported the Property Committee met 2/18. They hosted 1st Sunday Lunch in March. They sent back incorrect drawings for the new food pantry building and are waiting on the response. Ervin has fixed the lift in the basement. However, the elevator broke today. Preschool would like to put a white board in the classroom closest to the Fellowship Hall.
