Greetings, sisters and brothers, in the name of Jesus Christ, and glory be to God the Father.

The rays of the morning sun spill into the room, boldly declaring that the darkness of the night has given way to the light of morning. And as I awaken from sleep to that morning light, I am reminded of the biblical and Church Tradition of seeing each

morning as a testimony of the triumph of God in bringing light out of darkness,

testimony of new creation, a witness to the resurrection, an anticipation of the day's new possibilities in which God shows up, an occasion to give thanks and praise. It seems as if creation itself offers us reminders to be diligent in prayer.

Prayer is foundational to the Christian life, crucial to our progression and maturity of faith. In prayer, we stand before God, intentionally face towards Him, so there can be dialogue. In this conversation, we grow closer to the image and likeness of God, and the kingdom of God grows in our hearts.

There is so much confusion and darkness in the world today. We are constantly

bombarded with suffering and tragedy. The god of individualism crouches to devour us like a hungry, salivating lion, trying to turn us into a people who prize self indulgent, delusional fantasy as the truth, materialism as being more important than living a life of simplicity and charity. We live in a modern culture where we are desensitized to death, life is not valued, and relationships are too easily discarded. In a time and

culture that are more culturally sensitive to race, gender, religion, etc., people actually tend to be more prone to judge too harshly and too quickly see the faults in

others. Self righteousness and morally superior behavior is lifted up as virtues and true love for others is discarded. No longer does there seem to be a place for mutual respect in agreeing to disagree or trying to understand various points of view, but the one who shouts the loudest wins. We see all these things in politics, religion, social media, and every facet of our modern culture.

More than ever, we need to pray, both individually and corporately in worship. We need to be in the presence of Jesus Christ, who is the way, the truth, the resurrection, and the life. In Him, we can be a people of living, breathing prayer. We can be a

people who embody humility and repentance, mercy and forgiveness, and, most of all, a people of hospitality and love. May we take full advantage of the daylight and find time this day for prayer, joining our words with the psalmist, who says,

"This is the day the Lord has made; we will rejoice and be glad in it" (Ps. 118:24).






