Greetings everyone,

A big thank you to all involved in making our Lenten, Holy Week, and Easter Sunday services so meaningful and special. The altar guild, Worship & Music Committee, chancel choir, volunteer musicians, service groups, and our church staff all combined to decorate our sanctuary and grounds, provide meals, make our services pitch perfect, and help us all on our journey through Lent and into Easter. Kudos and thanks to you all.



Moving forward, Endowment Sunday is May 4th. Thankfully, Wittenberg was able to award \$7,200 spread across five applicant groups this year: Friendship Missionary Baptist Church, Redeemer Lutheran Church, B-L Summer Literacy Program, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, and Sole Stepping. The groups will be recognized at the 11 am service. Afterwards the Endowment Committee will be serving First Sunday lunch. Come join us!

Many thanks to Pastor Getz, Patricia Tiffner, and Sandy Rheingold for making plans to represent Wittenberg at the SC Synod Assembly in North Charleston in June. Please pray for them to have a meaningful experience and help our Synod move forward together.

Council approved at our last meeting moving forward with a plan with Dominion Energy to convert our lighting throughout the Educational Building to LED light fixtures in the coming months. Through a partnership with the federal government, Dominion will cover 90% of the cost, the church only 10%. Stuart Rheingold has confirmed that the work will take place beginning May 14 and should be complete within three days. Sometime in 2026, Dominion will conduct a similar process for the fellowship hall side of our facility (everything except the sanctuary). We will recoup our expenses within about three years and the change should help us save significantly on our energy costs over the coming decades. Stuart, Mike Nichols, and Ervin Caughman are working together to protect our interests on the project.

Council also decided to place a temporary hold on the cemetery fence project along Frances St. while we gather more information on fencing options/costs as well as to give our resident landscape engineer Greg Long time to do some fine grading of the property to ensure it is graded/leveled appropriately for our future burial needs. We may decide to move forward with the fence previously approved or we may vote to go with a higher-level fence to match the style installed about 10 years ago along North Lee St. Many thanks to Michael Guerette for leading this effort for us. First Sunday Lunch will take place on May 4 after 11:00 Worship. It will be sponsored by the Endowment Committee.





Meeting was called to order at 7:05pm. Stuart Rheingold did the devotions.

Pastor's report: March 2025 was 102 people vs March 2024 was 114 people attending church on Sunday; Higher attendance for Wednesday services; Rachel Young and Randy Fellers doing a great job on the music on Wednesdays; it seems to resonate in people's heart. Treasurer's report: Checking has \$47,536.00; Surplus is \$22,004.00; Reconciled is at \$331,000.00 plus, CDs are at \$46,000.00, Motion to approve by Ricky Frick and seconded by Mike Nichols.

President's report: We received a thank you letter from the Bishop for the money received; Bill Newmyer from Camp HUGG asked to use our bus from June 29 to July 4; Brent Shealy would like to use the fellowship hall on July 27, 2025; Ricky Frick asked to use the fellowship hall on Easter day afternoon; the battery and pads have been ordered for the AED defibrillator.
