Dear brothers and sisters,

During my time with you so far, I have been greatly impressed by your love for one another and for the community and your amazing spirit of thankfulness. It is this latter part that I wish to elaborate on today.

The word for Holy Communion is commonly known as the Eucharist. This comes from the Greek word "eucharistia", which literally means "act of thanksgiving." To live as Eucharistic people is to live as a people of thanks, a people who see life as a gift from God, and see new life as a gift of the Spirit, given to us by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Through our struggles and losses, through our grief and mourning, we come to recognize the gift of life in Christ. Thanksgiving starts and is perfected from above. Jesus is the gift that opens up our hearts, so the Spirit can be poured into it.

This world has given us plenty reasons to be bitter, resentful, and tight fisted when it comes to giving. But as a people of faith, hope, and love, we live with the assurance of God's abundance given to us by Jesus Christ. Living in the Spirit, we are able to better see the many blessings God gives us, especially the extravagant gift of God's never ending love. As we grow deeper in love with Christ, we become a people that give thanks for all the holy things we receive through Him, and this enables us to be more giving to others. In the Eucharist, we give our lives to God as a living sacrifice of thanks and praise, and Jesus gives us his life to forgive us our sins, encourage us in this life, nourish our faith, and pour his divine love of giving into our hearts.

Thank you all for all you do for our church. I can never say it enough. I thank God for how His Spirit is moving in our lives to be Eucharistic people. I think we do a great job of thanking people for what they do, but I imagine there are some who work behind the scenes that we may not have thought of thanking. For those folks, I say, "Thank you." I encourage you to continue being a people of thanksgiving, seeking out every opportunity to thank someone. A simple "thank you" has a powerful impact in encouraging a culture of thankfulness and giving.

The summer is almost here, so many of you will most likely be going on vacations and visiting family, but I encourage you to come to church on Sunday when you are able. It is here that we are able to be in the presence of Christ and be empowered to give to others in our community and be a people of thanksgiving and generosity.






