Did you know St. Nicholas was a real person who was a bishop in Turkey in the 4th C? The stories about his care for children and the poor are legendary and eventually grew into the figure of Santa Claus or Old St. Nick.

During the 11:00 am service on December 5th, St. Nicholas will visit our church during worship! Pastor Anderson will share the story of Nicholas,

especially the famous story of how he helped children who were poor. In honor of Nicholas, all children are asked to bring a 2lb bag of rice, a 2lb bag of pinto beans, canned tomato soup, or canned chicken noodle soup to support Wittenberg's ministries to those in our community who live with food insecurity.

The children of the congregation and of the preschool will sing together the song "The Lord is my Shepherd" that we have been learning during our weekly worship times together.

We hope to see you on December 5th, The Second Sunday of Advent!



Call to Order By Council President - Brian Shealy at 7:10 pm

Devotion – Chancie Frick – Gratitude changes everything.

Prayer Concerns - Discussed

Prior Meeting Minutes - previously approved via email

Pastor's Report – Pastor Mary Anderson report submitted by email. Also showed PowerPoint prepared by Jase Long (confirmation student) on his chosen mentor Ervin Caughman. Brian Shealy also gave thanks and appreciation to Pastor Anderson for doing what she does with the children in helping them in learning responsibility.

Treasurer's Report – submitted via email-Brent Shealy –Mentioned that the church continues to be in "good solid shape." Also mentioned the Vision 2020 mutual fund matured on October 22nd and just rolled over. Funds total approx. \$163,000. Motion to accept report as presented by Ricky Frick , 2nd by Matt Shealy. All in favor stated "aye". Report approved.

Financial Secretary Report- submitted verbally by Connie Kramer- Noted corrections to the Vision 2020 section. Corrected report was submitted via email after official meeting. Connie also stated that remained okay counting alone. Brian Shealy and council suggests that practices go back to before Covid way. (To include council members each week.) Motion to accept report as presented by Gregory Dority, 2nd by Ricky Frick. All in favor stated "aye". Report approved.

President's Report – a) No facility use requests. b) Covid Operations Update – Continues to move forward. Noted that the 1) Passing of the offering plate 2) Passing of peace 3) communion practices will continue to be on hold and practices will continue to be monitored. Ricky Frick inquired about "children's' church" starting back. Noted it was not stopped due to Covid but for staffing reasons and that current practices seemed to be working for all. Guest Book location not known at this time. Pastor Anderson and/or Brian Shealy will research. Also, Worship and Music committee presented request that the "Worship Assistant" be started back for the purpose of helping with Communion distribution. Discussed and council approved. C) Call committee update. 2nd interview of one of the candidates to take place in next week. 2 other prospects were thanked for their time and interest. Will continue to update Council of progress. d) Council goals 1) Delay in shipment of playground equipment for 4-6 weeks (could be 3 months) due to fire at manufacturing plant. Will be getting Preliminary Design for food pantry, parking, and building. Meeting to get things started again on Tuesday with Billy Rauton. Will get entire committee involved after this initial meeting. 2) No changes on Capital Campaign currently. 3) Call Process – See above. d) Hare Bequest –Spreadsheet presented by email. Noted that the Columbarium line item removed, due to high cost of item, and Wittenberg has lots of land available, so item not something needed immediately. Can revisit at later time.
