Greetings, Wittenberg family,

Near the end of this month, we will be celebrating Thanksgiving. Each day is an opportunity to give thanks to God for our "daily bread," all the things he provides for us. It is also an opportunity to remember those who may not be as fortunate and to show hospitality to those folks in need. Each Sunday, we "give thanks" in the Eucharistic celebration as we "do this in remembrance of me...". We are reminded of what Jesus did for us on the cross, what he continues to do for us through the Holy Spirit, and what he will do for us when he returns to set all things right.

This hoping, anticipating, and remembering helps us to see Jesus in our lives coming into our present as a gift. And it is the gift of Jesus' presence in our lives that empower us and equip us to live a life of love for God and for others, giving glory to God.





Andrew called the meeting to order at 7:00pm.

Pre-School: Debbie reported they had a clean audit. They hired one new employee (certified teacher) and one teacher left. They are looking into a new phone system. They are discussing the 2026 budget.

(Turkeys and either perishable or nonperishable holiday themed foods TBD)

Stewardship & Finance: Andrew reported we will defer to new business with 2026 Budget.

Worship & Music: Patricia reported the Blessing of Animals is 10/19 at 2:00. Alter Guild training session on 10/20 at 6:00pm. This will be followed by a Worship and Music meeting at 7:00. 
