## **PASTOR'S REPORT**

#### Submitted by Rev. Keith Getz, Pastor

Greetings, Wittenberg Family,

It has been a joy and blessing to serve as your pastor the past 7 months. What has stood out for me during our time together has been your infectious joy of serving the community and joy in having fellowship with one another. My family and I have enjoyed getting to know you all and look forward to getting to know you better as our relationship between us continues to grow. My family and I are also deeply moved by your generous hospitality towards us. It has certainly been a blessing to do ministry here in this place among God's people. Thank you very much for all you have done for the Getz family. Your love and support for us has touched our hearts deeply and mere words cannot fully express our appreciation. You have made us feel at home here. I also thank you for giving me the privilege of walking with you in your journey of faith.

#### Worship

We have continued this past year with our two Sunday services of Holy Communion at 8:30 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. The 8:30 service is a little less formal service and has been a great opportunity for some of our folks who are not able to come to our later and longer 11:00 service. This has also been a great resource for those who usually come to the 11:00 service but couldn't because of other obligations. I am thankful we have both service for folks to be fed, nourished, and strengthened in Word and Sacrament. We will continue to have Holy Communion at both services each week. I have also added back the Order of Confession and Forgiveness from the Lutheran Book of Worship (the green hymnal).

Also, I have added back the Post Communion canticle (we have been singing the Nunc dimittis, which are based on the words of Simeon's words about Jesus when Mary and Joseph present him at the temple). These minor changes have been well received by members of the congregation. Thank you all for participating in the bulletin survey. The majority of people wanted to keep a bulletin that has the liturgy in it, instead of a order of service bulletin. The results also showed that there were slightly more folks that wanted to keep the bulletin the same as it is now, without any revisions. Therefore, we will continue to keep our usual bulletin format. I have also added the wearing of the chasuble when presiding at the Eucharist, which may not have been done since perhaps Rev. Butler. The fullness of the chasuble represents the abundance of the Eucharistic feast and its abundant grace of Jesus Christ's real presence of his body and blood is for all the baptized.

I especially want to thank all those who serve during worship: our organist/pianist, our choir director, our choir (including singing leaders of the early service and instrumentalists at both services), acolytes, crucifers, alms bearers, ushers, Communion assistants, altar guild, lectors, and technology assistants. I also want to thank all those who serve our church, including: our parish administrator, council, committee leaders, and all those who work behind the scenes to take care of us, our church building, and God's ministries.

Our St. Nicholas Day commemoration on December 4th and St. Lucia Day commemoration on December 11 were very meaningful to people, and they enjoyed some of the new additions to those services. Special thanks to Robert Epting for doing so well as St. Nicholas, and special thanks to Ellie Getz for being a great St. Lucia. Also, special thanks to Randy Fellers for adapting the music for my text for the St. Lucia hymn. Our Christmas Eve services were at 5:30 P.M. and 10:30 P.M. These services had many of our youth participating, which was wonderful and meaningful. Christmas Day was on Sunday. We had one service for Christmas Day and New Year at 10:00 A.M. I look forward to working with the worship ministry at Wittenberg for future services.

#### **Faith Formation**

Confirmation: This year, we have four students: Ansley Gresham, Liam Getz, Kate Shealy, and Graham Watson. We have completed the Old Testament semester of this past year. We will be studying the New Testament in the New Year and have a year of Lutheran study. Our students have worked really hard, and we have had some great faith conversations. Thanks to all the parents and grandparents for their commitment and dedication to our student's Christian education.

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## PASTOR'S REPORT, CONT.

**Coffee and Conversation:** Our bible study group meets at 9:00 A.M. on Mondays. We have studied Isaiah, Psalms, Jesus as Healer, Jesus's Parables, and Luther's Small Catechism. This is a fun group who hunger for God's Word and desire to grow in their faith, seeing how God shows up in their lives, and how God's story of love and salvation in the Bible connects with our story.

Adult Vacation Bible Study: We studied about Creation and New Creation in light of Jesus Christ.

The majority of the Christian educational curriculum design and resources have been developed and accumulated by me, so that I can offer the best educational experience that is in keeping with our Lutheran theology and the theology of the early church.

#### Outreach

Preschool: We have chapel on Thursdays at 9:30 A.M. This has been a great opportunity to reach out to children in our community and spread the gospel of Jesus Christ and hopefully, through the power of the Spirit, plant that seed of faith. This year we blessed the preschool, students, teachers, and backpacks. We have talked about shining the light of Jesus, preparing ourselves for Jesus at Christmas, we have talked about Chrismons and saints Nicholas and Lucia. I have also tried to give spiritual guidance for the preschool ministry team.

### **Food Pantry**

Laura, some of our children, and I have enjoyed participating in the food pantry and soup kitchen ministry. This has been a powerful experience to connect with the community and see Christ in the face of those in need and in ourselves. We have also enjoyed the fellowship with other members.

In October, I had the privilege and joy of doing the invocation for the Batesburg-Leesville town council meeting, and I did a devotional for the B-L high school football team's dinner, which our Lutheran Men in Mission sponsored.

**Needs Based Assistance:** The parish administrator, Becky, and I have been working on a church policy for giving financial assistance to those in need.

#### **Ministerial Alliance**

I have been working with pastors from other churches to see how we can join our efforts in helping our community. I also participated in an ecumenical Thanksgiving service this year.

#### **Pastoral Care**

It has been a joy and honor to serve our homebound members and those who have come by my office for counseling. I have had many joyful and meaningful moments with our members (including those from Saluda, Aiken, and Lexington) as I have visited with them and brought them Holy Communion. I have also been to Aiken and Lexington, visiting folks in the hospital and praying with them.

#### **Parish Life and Youth**

My family and I have enjoyed spending time with our new family at Wittenberg, including our parish life trip to Hendersonville, NC to get apples and our youth trip to Carowinds and Saluda, NC. The youth events have been wonderful for our children, especially our youngest two, and Laura and I have been glad to participate and help chaperone.

It has been an amazing experience since we have joined the Wittenberg family, and I look forward to partnering with you in doing ministry in the new year.

We originally had our annual Council retreat scheduled but due to the ice storm we had to reschedule it to February. We held our retreat on February 6th which was the same day as the all committee night. Council set three goals for the 2022 year which are as follows: 1. Implementation of the facilities master plan for the church campus, 2. Launch a capital campaign, 3. Strategic Plan for faith formation and leadership development for Children and Youth. In addition to goal setting, the council enjoyed some team building exercises, and policies and procedure reviews. That same evening we enjoyed some pizza and met as individual committees to plan and set goals for 2022.

In March the call committee recommended Pastor Keith Getz for an interview. Council conducted that interview in March and unanimously passed to move forward in the call process and recommend Pastor Getz to the congregation. On April 10th we held a congregational meeting to vote on Pastor Getz as our next Pastor as well as the compensation package, both of which passed. On June 26th, 2022 we installed Pastor Getz as the new pastor of Wittenberg Lutheran Church.

We did make some progress towards goal number one, the playground was relocated to behind the church and new equipment and fencing were installed. The site plan was finalized for the food pantry and a task force was formed to help see this project through.

# CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL REPORT, CONT.

The council met monthly and items on the agenda included, devotions, voting of previous month minutes, Pastor's report, Treasury's Report, Financial Secretary Report, President Report as well as committee reports. We also reviewed and reported on the annual goals set by the congregation.

The annual congregation meeting was held December 11th, 2022 at both the 8:30 and 11:00 service. In this meeting we reviewed and voted on the 2023 budget as well as new council members for the 2023 year.

I have enjoyed my time serving as your President and want to thank the congregation of Wittenberg for all they do to make it such a special place. I appreciate all your support and everything you do!

<u>Stewardship and Finance:</u> (from the church constitution) Prepare a draft budget, Oversee the financial affairs of the congregation, Recommend to church council investments and insurance programs, Have annual audits of treasurer, financial secretary, accounts of the schools and organizations within the congregation, Evoke and promote the expression of Christian faith in daily living, Teach the Christian use of money, Diffuse information regarding local, national and world-wide ministries of the church, Lead all members to higher levels of proportionate giving for the Lord's work.

Social Ministry: Coordinate servers in food pantry & soup kitchen, deliver soup kitchen meals to shut-ins.

<u>Parish Life:</u> Plan trips for members, Help with OWLS luncheon, coordinate BBW (breakfast before worship), birth-day cards, and receptions/community meals, Assist in church office.

Preschool: Support Director and Assistant Director in the operation of the preschool

<u>Worship and Music:</u> Promote and invite singers for chancel choir, Secure singers and instrumentalists for early service, Secure lay readers and worship assistants, Secure acolytes and crucifers, Promote and support Altar Guild, Provide for nursery during worship, Secure ushers. Work with pastor and musicians to plan worship on special occasions.

<u>Audio Video & Technology:</u> Operate sound system for services, Maintain equipment, Live-stream 11 o'clock service and funerals as needed, Assist with use of Fellowship Hall equipment.

## **CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT**

Sunday School Classes in 2022

Children's Sunday School is taught regularly by Betsy Dority and Kayce Shealy. There was an average of four children who participated during the year in K-Grade 5.

The Confirmation class is taught by Pastor Keith and had 4 students. They studied the Old Testament this year.

Youth Sunday School is taught by Brian Shealy and is designed for middle and high school youth. They use the on-line ELCA resource called "Faith Lens" that connects the gospel for the Sunday to current events. This year they averaged about 8 participants each week.

The Young Adult Class is a smaller group of 3-4 participants who engaged in book study, conversation, and lectionary study.
