Food Ministries Update

For the month of February the Food Pantry served 202 families and the Soup Kitchen provided 165 meals. The Soup Kitchen also provided bag lunches each Saturday to the Food Pantry patrons. Thanks to all our many volunteers who keep these important ministries running smoothly. We were also able to provide the Food Pantry patrons hams for Thanksgiving and Christmas along with their usual food box. This was made possible by monetary donations given by our congregation.

The preschool started off the new year with learning about farming. WP Rawls came and taught us about growing crops and the types of crops they grow. We had some animals come visit from Twin City Farms and learned about the difference between pet animals and livestock. The children enjoyed getting up close with the different animals. We had one of our local chicken farmers come in to speak with us from Bruner Farms. We are so blessed to live in a community where our children can learn about where our food comes from and the hard work it takes to get to the grocery store.

We are wrapping up the month learning about how to stay safe in different ways. We are reviewing fire safety, bike safety, inclement weather safety and seatbelt safety. We have had lots of practice with the inclement weather safety this month. We had to gather in the basement a few times because of the threat of tornados.

We have welcomed a new employee to our staff. Nina Shealy has joined us as an assistant in our two's/ three's class. We are still hiring for afterschool teachers so please help us spread the word!






