Greetings, Wittenberg family,

And, what's more, you are needed in the family of God. Your absence impacts the life of the church, the life of our members. Your presence is important. Your presence may very well be the blessing God intends to give to someone else. One kind word from you may greatly change a person's attitude and someone's day. We should not underestimate our impact on each other's lives. As we continue our Lenten journey, may we renew our efforts and commitment to come to church, so Jesus Christ can transform us and use us to transform others. Hope to see you in church soon.





Approved Council Meeting Minutes, February 15, 2026:

- Members Present: Cher, Toshia, Pastor Keith, Marti, Connie, Ricky, Brent, Betsy, Michael, Jimmy, Taylor and Eric.
- I. Cher called the meeting to order at 6:02pm.
 - II. Toshia offered a devotion focusing on 2 Chronicles 20:12 and focusing on our view of God.
 - III. Prayer Concerns – Family of Mary Cook, Charlie Long, Family of John Levels and the Family of Mike Turner.
 - IV. Pastor emailed his report 2/11/26 and added that Mary Cook's funeral is this Thursday. Please keep her family in your prayers. Also please pray for Debbie Sawyer's Brother-In-Law as he is back in the hospital. Ricky motioned to accept Pastor's Report and Michael seconded.
 - V. Connie emailed her Financial Secretary's Report. We had an online donation come through for the Food Pantry and is not familiar with the name, so she does not have an address to send the acknowledgement. No one was familiar with the name, but we will try to figure it out. Ricky motioned to accept Connie's Financial Secretary's report and Jimmy seconded.
 - VI. Brent gave a Treasurer's Report. Brent reviewed the Balance Sheet as it was emailed. Offerings were off for January from last year. We did send \$5000 to Synod, \$3000 to SC Lutheran Retreat Centers and \$3000 to Disaster Relief of the Carolinas. Thrivent Annuities posted interest for 2025 in January. Cemetery Annuity is now \$203,883 and the WLC portion is \$201,411.48. The new budget is in QuickBooks now. The bill for the paint was paid 2/3/26. The WLPP portion of the painting is \$7640. Brent will work on a bill to send WLPP. Endowment had a good month. Endowment had an 11.5% increase from last year with \$207,626 compared to \$186,256 last year. The Endowment Committee will be meeting after Council. Michael motioned to accept Brent's Report and Taylor seconded.
 - VII. Cher gave a President's Report. We celebrated 3 work Anniversaries in January. Cher shared a Thank you letter from Dallas Shealy for the donation to the Lutheran Retreat Centers. First Sunday Lunch in March will be sponsored by the Evangelism/Christian Care & Parish Life. The First Sunday Lunch in April will be moved to the 2nd Sunday due to Easter. We discussed the 2026 Council Goals from Executive Committee. They are as follows.
Goal 1: Relaunch our KICS program by recruiting and training at least 2 volunteers and engaging the KICS children (ages K5 - 5th grade) in regular children ministries and activities.
Goal 2: Develop a strategy to incorporate more Youth members throughout in the Worship services (Reading Lessons, Ushers, etc.)
Goal 3: Reenergize First Sunday lunches:
Outreach with the homebound members (taking them bulletins, spending time with each member). Recruit a few more members to deliver the meals. Children to offer the blessing.
Goal 4: Develop a strategy to connect with new members of the B-L community, inviting them to visit Wittenberg. Maybe the Evangelism Committee could help with this goal. Possibly host a booth at the SC Poultry Festival. Add pamphlets to the Food Pantry boxes. Spring Clean-up Day 3/21 with town.
Goal 5: Enhance communications about our ministries at Wittenberg. *Each committee hosts Temple Talks during Sunday School opening, during worship services, First Sunday Lunches, etc.
*Reenergize Sunday School Opening
*Build up Sunday School Attendance (Invite more to Sunday School, publicize our Sunday School classes for all ages).
*More communication about OSJ. – more participation.

They are working on getting quotes on Gutter Guards for the entire perimeter of the church and for Parsonage.

Soup Kitchen served 150 families; **Stewardship & Finance:** Jimmy St. Jean- S&F met and went over financials prior to the Council meeting; **Strategic Planning:** Cher Davis – no report; **Worship & Music:** Patricia Tiffner – no report; **Youth:** Taylor Davis – Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. 2/28 Soup Kitchen. 3/15 game night. 3/21 B-L Spring Cleaning. 3/28 Soup Kitchen. 4/12 Youth Sunday. 4/19 assemble care packages for college students. 4/25 Soup Kitchen. Youth always involved on A/V during worship.

- We adjourned with the Lord's Prayer. Respectfully submitted, Betsy Dority


