Greetings, Wittenberg family.

At the end March, we will be celebrating the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter. Through the victory of Christ's death, he has conquered death and sin. Death becomes a means to enter more fully into the life of God. This dying in Christ begins at Holy Baptism and continues past our physical death into resurrected eternal life. What we celebrate and look forward to is our own resurrection, in which we are completely redeemed in body and soul. Too often we think of resurrection as our soul going to heaven but what the Church has always affirmed is a bodily resurrection. There is life after death, after death. Souls in heaven will be united with their resurrected immortal, imperishable bodies to live in God's new Jerusalem, his kingdom on earth. The trials, and troubles, and sorrows of this world are the birth pangs of the world as it groans toward new resurrected life. God calls us to participate in his changing the world and renewing his creation.

Through participation in the liturgy, we are able to be united with God to see with sanctified vision, which enables us to spread God's kingdom on earth to all those in our community and around the world. In the Word of Holy Scripture spoken and proclaimed in sermons, the Spirit enters into our ears and travels into our hearts, filling it with a burning joy and desire to spread the life-altering good news of Jesus Christ. In Holy Communion, we have a foretaste of the wedding feast to come and are united to God and one another through the broken body and poured blood of Christ on the Cross as we experience this offering of his life in bread broken and wine poured in the Eucharist. Just as Jesus gave us his life on the cross as an offering of love to his Father, so he continues to give his life to us, the Church, in every time and place, in this means of God's love. In all these means of grace, Christ increases in us as the old sinful self decreases, and we daily die to sin to be resurrected to new life. Our Christian journey toward Easter is always a movement from death into abundant, meaningful, divine life. In Christ, we celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death, precisely because we share in that victory. Joining our voices with the church on earth and in heaven, we eagerly anticipate our Lord's coming again, singing and shouting, "Alleluia! Jesus is risen!"

Food Ministries Update

For the month of January the Food Pantry served 186 families. The Soup Kitchen served 153 meals as well as providing bag lunches to the Food Pantry patrons each remaining Saturday of the month. Thanks to all our many volunteers who keep these important ministries running smoothly and to our congregation for their continued financial support. We received the following donations from the community: canned goods from Leesville United Methodist Church; loaves of bread for Soup Kitchen bag lunches from Bob Hall. Blessings abound from our congregation and community!





Our month started off with our teachers going to Greenville for training. They attended the South Carolina Early Childhood Association Conference. This was a 3 day conference full of lots of learning and team building for our staff. It is always good to spend time together away from preschool and get to know one another better.

We celebrated Valentine's day with a party at lunch and learned about God's love being the greatest love of all. We also have celebrated one year with Ms. Nina and two years with Ms. Kara as employees with WLPP.

The preschool held a career week where parents and members of the community came in to share about their careers with the children. We had a cosmetologist, Hannah Jumper come in and share with the children the different ways she styles hair. They discussed the different types and colors of hair. She sent the students home with their own new brush or comb. Hannah can be found working her magic at Main Street Hair Salon. Mrs. Nancy Upchurch is a local artist who came to share her talent of painting on olive wood with us. She did not start painting until she was 59 when the Lord blessed her with the ability to create beautiful pieces of artwork. Her wood comes straight from the olive trees of Bethlehem. The students got to see many different cuts of wood and see different shapes that the would can be cut into along with various paintings on the wood. Mrs. Nancy sent each student home with an olive tree wooden cross. Her work can be found in a couple stores on main street in Batesburg. One of our parents, Brittany Taylor, who works in the ER as a nurse came and shared how she helps treat boo boos and injuries. She brought some of the instruments with her that she uses on the job. We also had Mr. Justin Munn come and teach us about how he puts up the light poles so we can have electricity.



Approved Council Meeting Minutes, February 18, 2023:

Members Present: Robin Taylor, Wendy Epting, Mike Nichols, Brent Shealy, Pastor Keith Getz, Ross Cary, Jarrod Frick, Connie Kramer, Patricia Tiffner, Betsy Dority, Michael Guerette, Debbie Black and Andrew Hendrix.

Andrew called the meeting to order at 6:08pm.

Andrew Hendrix shared a fond childhood memory of growing up at Wittenberg then read a devotion on the 3rd chapter of John. Pastor Keith offered a prayer.

Prayer Concerns - Larry Dasher has been in the hospital and is back home. Helen Dasher has been in the hospital. Ben Barnes broke his pinky finger before church.

Pastor shared his report as previously emailed.

Our attendance has increased. Ash Wednesday attendance was in the 50s. He feels a lot of energy amongst the congregation. Taco Tuesdays, Coffee & Conversation, monthly Evening Bible Study and Bingo Night 2/17 have all been well attended and has been a good sense of fellowship and worship.

Wednesdays in Lent are looking exciting - he is hopeful this will be a series of powerful prayer services.

Confirmation class is going well with good conversations.

Jarrod motioned to accept the Pastor's Report. Ross seconded. All in favor.

Brent gave a Treasurer's Report.

Our WLC checking balance is \$22,537.61. Out of this amount are the following Restricted Funds:

Food Pantry \$15,818.87 Soup Kitchen \$9,330.98

Chrismon \$2.395.59

Prayer Garden \$4,533.00

Deficit as of January 31 - \$9,540.

All CDs and Money Market accounts are updated as of 1/31/23. Most of them have been renewed for between 3 to 9 months.

The 2 Annuities at Thrivent are updated once a year. Edward Jones Endowment fund is reconciled each month. All are updated for 2023 and are reflected in January statements.

One correction caught in the S&F meeting earlier: Money categorized in Evangelism Expense \$1,212.96 should be reclassified into Food Pantry. This is the total of credit card purchases from 1/1 – 1/23. This will be adjusted and reflected in the next month's report.

We will contribute the maximum amount (\$6500) for the Cemetery Annuity when we are able to.

Wendy asked what figures are in each Sunday's Bulletin financial report. Brent answered that the Bulletin report reflects as how we stand compared to the budget and not compared to our account balances. This is our Budget vs. Actual. Our YTD offerings are up 21.3%. Brent suggested Temple Talks about financials could be helpful at the Sunday School opening and in worship services.

Ross made a motion to accept Brent's Financial Report. Debbie seconded. All in favor.

Connie gave a Financial Secretary's Report.

January was not as good as December but that is to be expected.

Ross motioned to accept Connie's Financial Secretary's Report. Debbie seconded. All in favor.

Andrew gave a President's Report.

Kara Jefferson with Sole Stepping will be here on March 10 to give us information on her organization and how they would like to use our facilities.

Andrew shared and passed around Thank you cards from Rachel and Mary Ann from their Workplace Anniversaries.

Wendy motioned to accept Presidents report. Mike seconded. All approved.

Committee Reports AV - Betsy D. did not have a report.

Christian Ed - Andrew reported in Betsy M.'s absence that they will be meeting soon, and the Easter Egg hunt will be the Saturday before Faster

Endowment Committee – Andrew reported they will be meeting at 7pm with the goal to revise the application and make available for individuals or organizations to submit for our grant.
