As I entered the day room of an admission unit, I found a young man pacing about in conversation with someone only he could hear; in recovery, I see this young man smile at himself in the mirror as he prepares for work. Another individual sits in a seat with his heart throbbing in his chest, with feelings of anxiety and dread; in recovery, he will feel at ease as he leaves to meet with friends. A young girl waits to be called. She feels hopeless and alone; in recovery, she is happy as she goes to volunteer to read to the elderly in a nursing home. Who are they?

These people are individuals with mental illnesses. As with many physical diseases, mental illnesses are treatable, largely due to research outcomes, pharmaceutical advances, and an improved healthcare support system. Click here to read the entire article.








Approved Council Meeting Minutes, April 14, 2024:

Members present: Andrew Hendrix, Pastor Keith Getz, Robin Taylor, Brent Shealy, Ross Cary, Betsy Dority, Connie Kramer, Patricia Tiffner, Wendy Epting, Betsy McEwen, Justin Trotter and Debbie Black.

Andrew called the meeting to order at 7:05pm.

Betsy Dority shared of memory of growing up at Wittenberg and read a devotion on planting seeds.

Prayer Concerns – Jim Young, Mike and Virginia Nichols, Josh Quattlebaum and Ann Nichols. Congratulations to Lane & Cassidy on their wedding and Congratulations to Tim & Cambey Roof on Baker's Baptism.

-Pastor Getz reported that attendance is trending well. In March we averaged 22 in the 8:00 service and 92 in the 11:00 service. Our average attendance combining both services for last year was 91. Lenten service attendance was up. We had 171 at Easter service. -Ross made a motion allow a local AA group to meet at our church on Friday evenings and to authorize a key to a church member to open and close the church for these meetings. Betsy M. seconded. All were in favor.

-Ross made a motion to accept the Pastor's report. Debbie seconded. All were in favor.

Treasurer's Report

-Brent reported we ended February with a checking balance of \$23,654.

-We ended with a slightly larger restricted funds deficit of \$10,961 over February.

-We paid several large bills in March that include:

Property and Casualty Insurance quarterly installments \$3,770.50

Jason Feaster for vent work in Parsonage \$875. (this came out of Vision 20+20) Lexington Co \$2,290 in permit fees for the food pantry Kendall Elevator \$2,133 to fix the lift for the basement Confirmation Camp \$2,250

-Betsy M. asked about Preschool reimbursements. Brent answered the Preschool normally reimburses WLC for utilities at the end of the year. We had discussion on if they should reimburse for a portion of the cleaning services and/or Employee liability

-We have a 25% increase in regular offerings and a 17% increase in total support.

-Food Pantry offering for the year totals \$10,430.

-Additional Outreach offerings have been strong and are up compared to last year.

-Endowment balance is \$168,758, an increase of \$20,216 over last year.

-Ross made a motion to accept Brent's Treasurer's report. Wendy seconded. All were in favor.

Financial Secretary's Report

-Connie reported we continue to receive money periodically for the Prayer Garden.
-The Lenten Project offerings collected at meals and services totaled \$856.79. This money was designated for the Food Pantry.

-Debbie made a motion to accept Connie's Financial Secretary's report. Ross seconded. All were in favor.

President's Report

-Andrew reported we received a request last Sunday for use of our fellowship hall for a meal for the family of Virgil Leaphart on

Tuesday. Andrew approved.
-Andrew read a letter from Mt. Hebron with a \$220 contribution to our Food Pantry.

-Ross made a motion to accept Andrew's President's Report. Patricia seconded. All were in favor.

-Christian Education: Betsy M. reported Kayce is making plans for VBS 6/2-6/4. We had 11 at Easter Egg Hunt on 3/30. The children's choir is

practicing for a prelude on Pentecost.

Endowment: Andrew reported 4 recipients have been selected for the 2024 Endowment Grants- B-L Summer Literacy Program, Good Shepard Lutheran (Food Pantry) in Walterboro, Reformation Lutheran in Columbia (monthly meals and fellowship for homeless young people) and Our Place of Hope in Cayce. We are looking forward to Endowment Sunday Meal & Fellowship on May 5th.
-Evangelism & Christian Care: Wendy reported they provided 8 meals/visits to members in need in March. They also gave homemade bread

and visited to new members.

-Mutual Ministry: Andrew – no report
-Parish Life: Robin reported the trip planned to the State Farmers market is cancelled due to no one signing up. She is considering a Mother's
Day celebration – possibly cake after church or flowers to Mothers? There will be more to come on that event.
-Pre-School: Debbie reported they are discussing whether this is a Board or a Committee. She has been meeting with the Mary Ann who is
head of the Preschool Committee. Crissie Kirby volunteered to be the committee's secretary. Debbie and Betsy M. met with Vickey to go over financials. Vickey will start grant accounting to keep track of our grant money and expenditures. Once we look at open grants, they will start to look at how much they can move to CD's. -Social Ministry: Wendy reported the Food Pantry served 170 families in March and 105 meals from the Soup Kitchen. We received donations of canned goods from Leesville Methodist, a monetary donation from Wayne and Linda Eastman and loaves of bread, peanut butter, jelly and bananas from Bob Hall.

-Stewardship & Finance: Andrew reported Brent and Connie have already referenced a few things from our meeting that was held previously at
