Greetings, Wittenberg Family,

This month we will be commemorating a new feast day of the church called Creation in Christ Sunday. This feast day was adopted by the Revised Common Lectionary for celebrations to begin on September 6th (the first Sunday) in 2026. This new feast day is ecumenical, meaning many other church denominations will recognize the feast day, showing global support and unity from various church bodies. Creation in Christ is very timely given our current situation of our environment and the damage that is being done to our natural resources, habitats, and animals.

This new feast day has ancient roots in the Byzantine tradition of the church, and its source comes from the liturgical feast known as the Feast of Indication, which celebrated the new liturgical year, in which the church gave praise to God as creator of the world. Its focus is on pondering how all things come into being through Christ, which inspires us to take good care of the world that God has given us.

This celebration also reminds us that we, who are created in the image and likeness of God (which is to say that we bear the image of the invisible God, who is Christ, and grow into the likeness of Jesus) are called to take good care of creation, offering it back to God in worship and praise.

It is my hope that this new feast will help us to better see the mystery of the Holy Trinity within creation, see the transcendent beauty of our world, which points to the Beauty. And, by doing so, it will help us to better think about how we can best reveal the transformative power of the gospel of Jesus Christ by the way we work for the flourishing of God's creation. The way we treat our fellow human beings and how we treat our environment (God's creation) are intimately connected, revealing whether or not we are people living according to the flesh, held captive to sin, or people living according to the Spirit, doing what is good and pleasing to God. I look forward to celebrating Creation in Christ Sunday in September and hope to see you in worship soon.

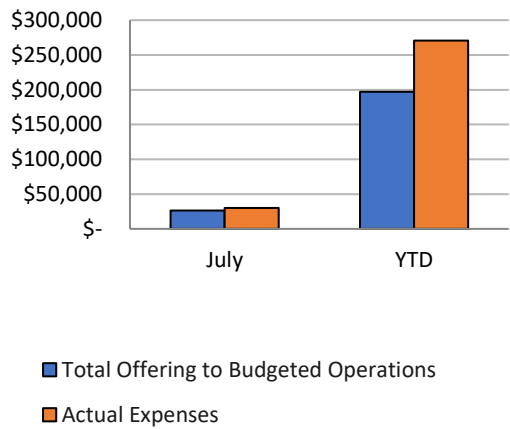

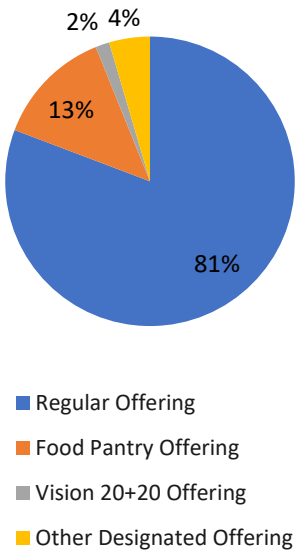

Approved Council Meeting Minutes, August 9, 2026:

Members Present: Cher, Toshia, Marti, Jimmy, Ricky, Betsy, Debbie, Brent, Pastor Keith, Taylor, and Eric.

Cher called the meeting to order at 7:04pm.

Ricky led devotions based on Galatians 6. Every time you do good things, a seed is planted. Do not be discouraged, keep doing for the good.

Cards: Connie Kramer, Brenda Gunter, and Mike Nichols.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Keith reported the Youth Event tonight had 3 adults and 10 kids in attendance. He emailed his report earlier this week.

Financial Secretary's report: no report.

Treasurer's report: Brent reported we are in pretty good shape. Property & Casualty insurance has a deductible of \$10,000. Hopefully insurance will help with the elevator and cemetery issues. We do have reserves if we need them. On the Income Statement, our YTD reg offerings are 5.3% ahead of last year. Restricted Funds offerings have a 9.1% increase over last year. The Endowment Fund ended July with an 9% increase. Debbie motioned to accept Brent's Treasurer's report and Ricky seconded.

Presidents Report: Cher reported that at the Executive Committee meeting 8/6/26, Michael Guerette resigned effective immediately. He has a contract on his home and will be moving at any time. Toshia, Debbie and Cher have volunteered to fill in for the 3 dates that he has Teller duties. Eric will take devotion for him in September.

1st Sunday lunch in September is Mutual Ministry. Greg Long will cook leg quarters and slaw. In light of Connie's health concerns and issues, Jimmy St. Jean has agreed to take over Financial Secretary duties as of 1/1/27. We discussed changing the schedule for 1st Sunday Lunch to quarterly instead of monthly. Then we discussed ways to get other people involved in 1st Sunday Lunch that may not be on a committee. Also talked about the idea of having more pot-luck lunches scheduled. Marti motioned to accept Cher's President's report and Taylor seconded.

Committee Reports

AV – Taylor reported we had a lightning strike that caused damage. Ricky motioned to accept Taylor's AV report and Jimmy seconded.

Cemetery Report – Cher reported just before noon on 8/7/26, a pick up truck traveling south on N. Lee collided with power pole, 2 brick columns, 190ft. of fence torn, traveled 180ft through the cemetery before the truck came to a stop. Tony Snelgrove came to assess damage and prop some of the headstones up. He is coming back tomorrow morning to assess more of the damage. Greg Long and family came Saturday to clean up the fence and brick columns that were destroyed. All was reported to congregation in 3 temple talks (8:30 worship, Sunday school opening and 11:00 worship). We are in the process of getting headstone, coping, and fence quotes. Brent has filed the claim against the insurance. We have a police report and Progressive has the report. Next step is the adjuster will reach out to come assess. Ricky motioned to accept Cher's Property report and Taylor seconded.

Christian Ed – Betsy reported Rally Day will be the last Sunday in August. The children are singing with the men's choir 8/16. Debbie motioned to accept Betsy's Christian Ed report and Taylor seconded.

Endowment – no report.

Evangelism & Christian Care – no report

Mutual Ministry – no report

Parish Life – Toshia reported she is working on planning an Apple picking outing for the fall. The Owls Luncheon is scheduled for 10/11. She is planning a date to eat at Old McDonald's Farm. Taylor motioned to accept Toshia's report and Ricky seconded.

Preschool – Debbie reported they will be working on their budget in September. They will have the budget to Cher by 11/16 so it can go to the congregation. They will share the cost of the lightning strike with WLC for damage to the phone system. The Preschool Study Group did a study on what financials would look like with a new building. Next month, they will look at the cost of doing an extension of the existing building. Taylor motioned to accept Debbie's report and Jimmy seconded.

Property – Cher reported on 7/6/26 lightning knocked out phone, internet, fire alarm and elevator. Southern Elevator has deemed the parts needed to repair the elevator as obsolete. There are new codes in SC that state the elevator control room must be in a climate-controlled room with its own unit. They are estimating the elevator repair and modifications to exceed \$100,000. This does not include the HVAC work. Prop Committee is recommending we seek an insurance claim. All bills will be totaled to go towards our deductible. Eric motioned to accept Cher's report and Ricky seconded.

Social Ministry – Ricky reported they served 100 bagged lunches, 130 plates served in soup kitchen and 237 families served in food pantry in July. They have had donations of fresh fruits and veggies. All voted in favor of Publix coming the 1st Sunday in September for flu shots and covid shots. Taylor motioned to accept Ricky's report and Jimmy seconded.

S&F – Jimmy reported they are planning the 2027 budget. All committee chairs please look at your budget amount, and see if your budget amount needs to be adjusted. Ricky motioned to accept Jimmy's report and Taylor seconded.

Strategic planning – no report

Worship & Music – no report

Youth – Tonight's Pizza party went well. 8/30 Youth Lake Outing. Ricky motioned to accept Taylor's report and Jimmy seconded.

Other New Business – none

Old Business - none

We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:12pm.

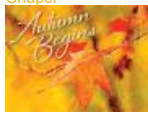
