



Devotion by Mike Nichols on the meaning of "The Lord's Prayer".

Prayer concerns: Tom & Debbie Sawyer's niece, Carl Vansant's brother has passed away, Pastor's mom, Justin Trotter's mom was diagnosed with cancer. Kim Hendrix thanked everyone for their prayers regarding her dad.

Pastor's report: Attendance has been growing. In April 2024 was 99, in April 2025 is 130. Confirmation classes have ended for the summer. Motion to accept by Patricia Tiffner, seconded by Mike Nichols.

Financial secretary's report: Need to add Thrivent funds of \$202.00 to the report, hurricane funds collected of \$1,747.00. Motion to accept by Patricia Tiffner, seconded by Robin Taylor.

Treasurer's report: South State Checking is \$41,530.87, food pantry surplus \$10,347.72, soup kitchen surplus \$7,725.99, actual checking balance is \$70,430.87. Brent mentioned that we are chipping away at the surplus. Motion to accept by Kim Hendrix, seconded by Patricia Tiffner.

President's report: Workplace anniversaries this month, Becky Hughes. and Pastor Keith Getz. will be mentioned at Sunday's services on May 25, 2025. First Sunday lunch in June 2025. Motion to accept by Robin Taylor, seconded by Mike Nichols.

Cemetery committee: no report.

Christian education: June 1st the Christian Ed. Committee will provide the first Sunday lunch; also, June 1st we will be recognizing our high school and college graduates; VBS will be from June 1^{sst} -3rd from 6 to 8 pm; four of our young people will be confirmed on June 8, Pentecost. We will also honor them with a reception after lunch that day.
