I guess what I am trying to say is that our offerings, our gifts, have changed and are changing lives. As we quickly approach the coming of a new year, I encourage us all to prayerfully discern where Jesus Christ is calling us to serve and how much we can give financially for the glory of God.





Devotion by Betsy D. was about "Growing in Faith".

**Prayer concerns:** Helen Dasher, Chip Spradley is having surgery, Chris Taylor is having back surgery, send a card to N. Lawson.

**Pastor's report:** Attendance in October 2024 was 110 people; October this year is 100 people. Our worship and music have been exceptional and powerful, truly a gift from God. Motion to accept report by Ricky, seconded by Taylor.

**Financial secretary's report:** Food pantry surplus is \$11,848.98; soup kitchen surplus is \$8,042.86; South State checking balance sheet is at \$69,927.42; Hare reserve is at \$28,475.00. Motion to accept report by Mike N. seconded by Michael G.

Treasurer's report: Total offerings in October was \$63,054.24; vision 20/20 balance YTD is at \$6.341.70; motion to accept report by Ricky, seconded by Betsy M.

**President's report:** Ricky F. requested the use of the Fellowship Hall on Nov. 27; the First Sunday lunch will be provided by the Worship & Music Committee; Motion to accept report by Kim, seconded by Debbie.

**Property committee's report:** Quiet for repairs; the elevator broke; Chrismon tree set up soon; getting estimates for some painting.

**Social ministry report:** The food pantry served 305 families in October; the soup kitchen served 110 meals; the "Fill the Fridge" is still planned for November 22; BLPD has been contacted for traffic control; boxes will be prepared with Thanksgiving meals; it looks to be about 250 turkeys and whole chickens if we run out of turkeys.

Stewardship and Finance: no report.

**Worship and Music committee:** There will be Advent services on Wednesdays, Christmas Eve services and St. Nicholas day will be on December 7.

Youth and AV/T committee: no report.

**Cemetery committee:** Still planning to fix some sagging plots with the Boy Scouts this winter.

**Christian Education Committee:** Music for the children's part of the Christmas family service is being planned and will be finalized with Pastor Keith in the next few weeks; Summer Lawson will be co-chairing the family service preparation and performance.

**Endowment committee:** no report.

**Evangelism & Christian Care:** Took one meal to a shut-in.

**Mutual Ministry**: They will meet in January 2026.

Parish Life: 90 meals were served for the First Sunday Lunch.

**Pre-School Committee:** The children met with veterans; Dec. 11 will be the staff Christmas party; also we discussed the staff's Christmas bonuses.
