For the month of July the Food Pantry served 195 families. The Soup Kitchen provided 127 meals as well as bag lunches each Saturday to the Food Pantry patrons. Thanks to our many volunteers who keep these important ministries running smoothly. This month the Soup Kitchen was blessed by Bob, Cindy, and Casey Grandy by providing bag



lunches one Saturday to the Food Pantry patrons. Blessings abound from our congregation and community!



Here at the preschool we are settling into our new routines and exploring our new classrooms. We spent the month learning about each other and making new friends. Our students have also been learning about feelings and how we express our emotions. We had 6 new students start with us this month! We are so excited to welcome these new families into our school!

We started a science program with our after school students called Snapology. We are also looking forward to starting a gymnastics class in September with Kelley's Gymnastics.

We said "goodbye" to Ms. Ellie, who helped us this summer and have missed her help the last few weeks. We wish her a wonderful year at Clemson! We still need one part-time morning person and a part-time afternoon person to help guide and care for our little ones.

Batesburg-Leesville Schools My name is Marett Bishop and I am the District Social Worker for Lexington School District Three. During the 2022-2023 school year we were able to provide 96 children with WEEKLY backpack food assistance through local partnerships, grants, and other donations. Unfortunately, the rising cost of food has made it nearly impossible to continue purchasing food bags from Harvest Hope. 





Ross Cary called for a recess to call Gerrie Gresham about the budgeted amount of money allowed. The original motion was withdrawn by Betsy McEwen.
