Greetings, Wittenberg family.

Hanging in my office is a holy icon called "The Bread of Life." It is a visual depiction of Jesus' words in the Gospel of John:

"I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty" (6:35). Jesus is in a chalice, blessing the one who gazes upon the icon. The Eucharistic significance is unmistakable. In Holy Communion, we encounter Jesus Christ, the crucified and risen Lord, who continues to give his life to us as a blessing. The background of the icon is made up of two colors: the top is gold and the bottom is green. The gold symbolizes heavenly glory and the green symbolizes life.

Much like Jesus' cup of life in the icon and in Holy Communion, we, too have a cup of life. This cup is filled with the sour vinegar of our sorrows but also the sweet wine of our joys. We have to be willing to drink both if we are to move from death to life. We have to be willing to go through the darkness of grief and pain to be given new life and move forward.

We tend to think it is easier to drink our cup of life if we have more stuff, but this is not really true. Studies have shown, that after a certain level of financial stability, one's happiness is not directly proportionate to the amount of one's money. Many times the more stuff (and trying to maintain or protect our stuff) can actually cause more stress and unhappiness. Most of the times, it is the one who lives more simply and has enough to live on that is much happier than the one who is always trying to acquire more and better stuff.

Perhaps one way to illustrate this would be to look at a wine glass. You can have a cheap wine glass or the finest Waterford crystal but do they change the taste of the wine? The wine is not any better in a more expensive vessel.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus encounters a man who asks what he must do to inherit eternal life (Mark 10:17-23). Jesus' response to the man's question is to "sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven." Jesus tells the man this, because Jesus loves him; he wants the man to see that it is impossible to save oneself. The man's many possessions had possessed him and made him believe that he is able to have eternal life on his own abilities. Jesus invites the man to a total transformation of his life. It is precisely the man's possessions that hinder him from moving forward in this new life.

Jesus declares God's promise: "How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God! ... For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible" (Mark 10:23, 27). It is not one's possessions that secures our life but God's presence in our life through Jesus Christ. The man could have lived in the freedom of God's love, giving to those in need. He could have received what his heart truly longed for: eternal life with God. In Jesus Christ, all things are possible. Unfortunately, his many possessions hindered him from having life in Christ.

It seems to me, that in receiving and drinking the cup of Christ's life in the Eucharist, we are empowered and strengthened to drink our own cup of life with its sorrows and joys. We are able to receive what our hearts long for, which is a life with God. And the gratefulness and joy of a new life as children of God transforms us to live more simply and give more joyfully and generously.

Our offerings are a powerful witness to our commitment to Jesus Christ and an incredible testimony to what Christ has done, is doing, and will do in our life. Christ blesses our monetary gifts, not just so we can pay our bills for our operating expenses, but so we can continue to have a place where people in the community can come and experience the crucified and risen Christ in Word and Sacrament, in worship and fellowship. Our offerings also help us to be a church on the move, reaching out and into the messiness of people's lives in the community, so they can experience the kingdom of God is near and come to know the love of God in Christ Jesus.
